

Website Analytics: March 2022 – August 2022 (new website launched in August after a successful migration)





During this period, ACB's website had 46 471 visits from Users. Users interacted with ACB's website 93 493 times.



The ACB has submitted comments to the DALRRD regarding the Regulations to implement the Plant Improvement Act and Plant Breeders' Rights Act, 2018.

The bias towards commercial seed interests is strong, with small-scale farmers and their seed dealt with as exceptions, which only allows farmer seed systems to operate in a limited way.

These exceptions do not constitute legal measures toward descaling industrial agriculture and upscaling agricultural biodiverse, agroecological, regenerative and just agricultural and seed and food systems. Thus, the fundamental needs to support farmer seed systems, ensure the rights and needs of farmers are adequately addressed, and the safeguarding of genetic and agricultural diversity, are absent. Push for Bt Cowpea in Nigeria. March 2022



Second Night for Global Social Rights



The second edition of the Night of Global Social Rights (NGSR), a 24-hour conversation on social rights, neocolonialism, and modern slavery, hosted by Rosa Luxemburg Foundation – Geneva Office and Civic City, in the framework of the World Social Forum (WSF), a platform for CSOs to mobilise for social progress, starts today at 12 noon CET. The panel including ACB's ED Mariam Mayet, Special UN Rapporteur on the Right to Food who shared insights around Why and How to Decolonise Food Systems. The event was held in two Studios with in-person audiences: one in HEAD-Geneva, and one in Mexico City within the framework of the World Social Forum 87 guests from 42 cities, belonging to 67 organizations and collectivities. It gained 2040 attendees connected virtually to the debates and conversations and about 40 participants in the Mexico studio and about 20 people in the Geneva studio.





History of Maize Cultivation and Consumption in South Africa 1




