is called the 'maize value chain'.

WHO CONTRIBUTE OUR MAIZE

In South Africa, the maize value chain is controlled by only a few very powerful companies:

Monsanto and Pioneer Hi-Bred (both from the USA) control the maize seed market.

Three former co-operatives that functioned in the agriculture sector under apartheid, - Afgri, Senwes and NWK - own 74% of the silos that store maize grain in very large quantities.

Two multinational companies that transport grain around the world - Cargill and Louis Dreyfus - control 70% of the maize traded on the Johannesburg Stock Exchange.

Tiger Brands, Premier Foods and Pioneer Foods, who control the maize meal market, also control the milling of 60% of all white maize produced in South Africa.

Shoprite/Checkers, Pick n Pay, Spar, Woolworths and Massmart, own 60% of the food bought and sold in South Africa.

It is shocking that in South Africa a handful of very powerful corporations control how and what we eat!
